Ephesians 1:15-23

In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God’s own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. RECOGNITION TREE

Starting **October 1st**, we will be selling leaves from our *Recognition Tree* in the back of the Narthex. This is a special opportunity to honor, remember, or recognize loved ones. The fundraiser will continue through the **end of November**, at which time all dedication forms will be sent in for engraving. Each leaf can hold up to 20 characters per line, including letters, spaces, and punctuation. Dedications are available for **\$250 per leaf**. Forms are now available at the church entrances and in the church office.

Please make all checks payable to **Camp Chapel UMC**. Turnaround time is approximately 2–3 weeks from the time the engraving company receives the forms. Once engraved, the new leaf will replace a blank one, so the tree always looks complete.

100% of the proceeds will go directly back into church funds. We invite you to consider purchasing a leaf in honor of someone who has made a lasting impact in your life.

Engraving Samples

To the right are samples of what the engraving on the leaves might look like. All Camp Chapel's plates are gold in color.

We are accepting only one dedication per leaf. The dedication may include more than one person if it is a Mr & Mrs. Doe or John & Jane Doe, or The Doe family (1st line) - Jhon, Jane, Tom, Sue.



The limit is 20 characters per line and 2-3 line limit to keep the print at a readable size. Characters include letters, spaces, and punctuation.



You will be asked to sign for your dedications to confirm the spelling & wording. Please print legibly.

The engraving takes approximately two weeks once the company receives the request.
