Isaiah 2:1-5

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." *Gospel Lesson

Matthew 24:36-44

But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in the days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so, too, will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken, and one will be left. Keep awake, therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore, you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.

The fundraiser continues through **November**, at which time all forms will be sent for engraving. Each leaf holds up to 20 characters per line, including letters, spaces & punctuation. Dedications are available for \$250 per leaf. Forms are available at the church entrances and in the church office. Please make all checks payable to **Camp Chapel UMC**. Turnaround time is approx. 2–3 weeks from the time the engraving company receives the forms. Once engraved, the new leaf will replace a blank one, so our tree looks complete. 100% of the proceeds will go directly back into church funds. We invite you to consider purchasing a leaf in honor of someone who has made a lasting impact in your life.
